<sup>1</sup>Examinations consisting of several parts can only be passed if all subjects receive a pass grade. Final examinations and diploma examinations including more than one subject receive an additional comprehensive assessment. This can be „BESTANDEN“ (pass) if all parts are positive and „NICHT BESTANDEN“ (fail). The comprehensive assessment will be graded „MIT AUSZEICHNUNG BESTANDEN“ (pass with distinction), when there are no subjects with a grade inferior than „GUT“ (good) and at least half of the subjects are „SEHR GUT“ (excellent). <sup>2</sup>ACADEMIC GRADING SYSTEM IN FRANCE Grades in France are awarded on a scale of 0-20. The passing grade for a single subject is usually 10/20. A student is considered to have passed the year when the combined weighted average of all his or her grades for that year comes to at least 10. Each student is given his exam results by the host institution within 5 weeks after the assessment period.

<sup>3</sup>Course completion at UPOL: Course completion shall mean meeting the course requirements through any of the following: a) course credit, b) colloquium, c) examination. The examiner shall decide on the result of the course completion under Paragraph 1. Courses are usually completed during the examination period as defined in the Academic Calendar of the academic year. If arranged



so with the examiner, courses may also be completed during the holidays or the teaching period of the semester. The examiner shall use the following grades for the assessment of an examination: A, B, C, D, E and F. In the event that the student has failed the examination (got the F grade under then he is entitled to a first re-sit . Further information are available at Study and Examination code:
